The Empower Works program began in August of 2022 with an entrepreneurship course developed to introduce students to the entrepreneurship mindset. During this course, students not only participated in activities to develop the mindset, but they also learned to how to determine what product/idea to create through researching societal need entrepreneurship. Students researched products on the internet to determine what to create and how to market them. The products were sold at Unique Like Me (ULM) in Painesville and sold at the Job Training annual fundraiser. Finally through a local speaker series, they decided which community organizations they would support.
