

We will staff and meet the needs of all confirmed registrations. This includes two full day classrooms.

- Classrooms will be capped at 16 students
- All **District** safety protocols will be in place
- Drop off / pick up will be one by one at the South St. entrance
- No visitors will be permitted in the building
- Adult-to-adult interactions will be limited in accordance with the American Association of Pediatrics Guidance

## Will I have to take my child's temperature daily?

Yes, please complete a daily COVID 19 symptoms assessment on your child. Teachers will also take student temperatures as they exit the car. Students with temperatures that exceed 100 degrees Fahrenheit will need to return home with their parents and should be monitored for additional symptoms.

## What happens if my child becomes sick at school?

The nurse/health aide will isolate students showing symptoms to a separate area away from other students already in the clinic. (Area to be determined) Students who exhibit symptoms or have a fever above 100\*F will be quarantined in a separate area (the area to be determined) with a mask to reduce the transmission of any potential illness. Parents or caregivers will be expected to pick up their ill child **within 30 minutes** of notification from the clinic. The nurse/health aide will work with custodial staff to ensure the clinic (and isolation area) is disinfected immediately following a student entering who is exhibiting symptoms.

## What type of notifications will be sent to parents if other students or families have positive test results?

If an individual who has been in a school is lab-confirmed to have COVID-19, the school must notify its local health department, in accordance with applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations, including confidentiality requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). The school will follow the local and state health departments and CDC guidance in that case. Schools must close off areas that are heavily used by the individual with the lab-confirmed case (student, teacher, or staff) until the non-porous surfaces in those areas can be disinfected unless more than 3 days have already passed since that person was on campus. Consistent with school notification requirements for other communicable diseases, and consistent with legal confidentiality requirements, schools must notify all teachers, staff, and families of all students in a school if a lab-confirmed COVID-19 case is identified among students, teachers, or staff who participate in any on-campus activities. FHEVS will monitor absenteeism, a cluster of cases, and address flare-ups. It is recommended that the student's family, caregivers, and staff members notify the school if they have been placed in isolation or quarantine.

## Masks/face coverings are a public safety necessity.

Mask exemptions are available to:

- Individuals with a health condition that prevents them from wearing face coverings (requires medical documentation)
- Individuals actively eating or drinking
- Staff members alone in their office or classroom
- Students and staff with an exemption are expected to wear a face shield
