Community Employers require all Unique Like Me (ULM)job training students and staff to follow their employee dress code policy. Creating a dress code for the workplace is very important for both staff & students working within a community setting. Implementing a work dress code will teach our students the difference between work uniforms and school clothes. Teaching our students how to dress appropriately while working at a job site is the beginning of competitive work and becoming an adult.

At ULM, the students are socializing with a great deal of interaction with the public, image is very important. Many employers will be turned off by student & staff members who dress inappropriately, carelessly or wear clothing with potentially offensive images or words. This type of dress can also have a serious negative impact on employee performance as well. If a coworker proves to be a distraction, the other employees will have a hard time concentrating on their work. Students & Staff are expected to maintain appropriate hygiene and arrive to work dressed in an appropriate uniform.
